of the list of designated authorities which have access to data recorded in the Central System of

Pursuant to Article 27(2) of the Eurodac Regulation (EU) No 603/2013, for the purpose laid down in Article 1(1) of the same Regulation, the Member States shall update the list of designated authorities that have access to data recorded in the Central System of Eurodac.

Based on the initial list of designated authorities published in the Official Journal of the EU on 20 July 2015 (OJ C 237), the Eurodac Advisory Group was consulted between 29 March and 12 April 2022 with a view to verifying the data for publication on eu-LISA's website for this year. The feedback received from the Member States was taken into account in the consolidated list of designated authorities for 2022 (document 2022-152, both clean and track changes version).

On 13 April 2022, written procedure was launched for decision of the Management Board to adopt the list of designated authorities that have access to data recorded in the Central System of Eurodac (document 2022-153).

By the deadline of the written procedure on 28 April 2022, LT, GR, SE and COM requested changes in the references, names and/or addresses of the designated authorities. The changes were addressed and incorporated in the final version of the document (document 2022-152 REV1, both clean and track changes version).

Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of the Agency's Rules of Procedure, the Management Board has taken the following decision by written procedure:

The Management Board decides to adopt of the list of designated authorities which have access to data recorded in the Central System of Eurodac as set in document 2022-152 REV1.
