





eu-LISA publishes different system-related reports aimed at raising awareness and increasing the visibility of the IT systems under its operational management. The reports cover both the technical functioning of each system, as well as usage statistics.

In addition to general public information, the reports support decision-makers from the European Parliament, the Council, the Commission, and the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS).



MONITORING, ANALYSING AND OUTLINING ACTIVITIES

For each of the reports, the eu-LISA Statistics Function is responsible for gathering external contributions such as statistical data provided by the Central Systems and by the EU Member States using the systems.

In addition to the statistical reports, the Agency also prepares:

- A factsheet outlining the main facts and figures from each report;
- The consolidated lists of designated authorities that have access to the systems;
- The reports on the technical functioning of the systems, outlining the activities carried out during the operational management, which comprise:
 - Monitoring;
 - Change management;
 - Testing;
 - Version releases;
 - Performance assessments;
 - Training activities;
 - Security assessments.

Reports and statistics for the systems under development (EES, ETIAS, ECRIS-TCN), as well as the upcoming e-CODEX, will also be published regularly once they enter into operation.

Since eu-LISA's establishment in 2012, the Agency has become the digital engine of Schengen and is responsible for managing and promoting IT as a key success factor for the implementation of the European Union's policies in the area of freedom, security and justice. Over the years, the Agency's mandate has considerably expanded. On top of the operational management of Eurodac, SIS and VIS, eu-LISA also assumed responsibility for the development of EES, ETIAS, ECRIS-TCN, and the Interoperability framework. The Agency has also been entrusted to take over e-CODEX, a tool for cross-border judicial cooperation.

Thus, eu-LISA is in the driver's seat for the digitalisation efforts of the EU's Justice and Home Affairs domain, building a new information architecture for border management and contributing to the development of the new security ecosystem.

Through its activities and tasks, which fully respect EU data protection and privacy requirements, the Agency adds value to the EU Member States by supporting their efforts towards freedom, security and justice.
