Executive Director

Tillmann KEBER was appointed Executive Director of eu-LISA on June 18th, 2025 and assumed his duties on October 1st, 2025.

Mr Keber comes from an extensive career in the German police forces, having most recently been the Head of Division for Police Information Systems in the Federal Ministry of the Interior and Community. In this role, he was responsible for regulating police data exchanges and the operational management of national police-centric IT systems. He was furthermore also in charge of the legislative implementation, at national level, of several of the IT systems in eu-LISA portfolio,

including the Schengen Information System and the soon to come Interoperability components.

Prior to being Head of Division, Mr Keber was Chief of Staff for the German Federal Criminal Police Office. His tasks included press relations, information exchange, IT matters, strategic planning, as well as cooperation and communication with international partners.

Driven by his studies in law (Dr. iur./ LL.D), Mr Keber's early career centred around roles that incorporated legal and administrative functions. These varied from being a Legal expert, a personnel officer and a lawyer.

About eu-LISA

eu-LISA started its operations in 2012 to manage large-scale information systems in the area of freedom, security and justice. The Agency's portfolio includes Eurodac (a centralised fingerprints database), the Schengen Information System (SIS) and the Visa Information System (VIS), which support the implementation of the EU's border management, migration and internal security policies.

eu-LISA's mandate was broadened in 2018 to implement Interoperability between existing and new systems, including the Entry/Exit System (EES), the European Travel Information Authorisation System (ETIAS) and the European Criminal Records Information System - Third Country Nationals (ECRIS-TCN). In 2024, the Agency took over the management of the cross-border justice tool, e-CODEX. The seat of the Agency is in Tallinn, (EE), while the operational management is carried out in Strasbourg (FR). eu-LISA also has a technical business continuity site in St. Johann im Pongau (AT) and a liaison office in Brussels (BE).
